1.Call to Order meeting was called to order by Ted Card at 10:15am

2. Establish a Quorum A quorum was established

3. Approve or change agenda Ted Card added Beef Farm Distinction- Washington County volunteers

4. Approval or correction of minutes from Sept. 25th, 2021 @ Beef Expo Peter Lehning moved to accept the meeting minutes from September 25th at the Beef Expo. Barb Benjamin 2nd. All in favor. Minutes were approved as read.

5. Treasurer's Report – Kathi Wagner

a. Financial Report (including Beef Expo Weekend) (Action/Approval)

b. 2022 Budget (Action/Approval)

-We brought in a total income of \$29,000 from the meat raffle

-The Beef Expo brought in approximately \$450

-We didn't have an income in the past couple of months from "Raise the Roof"- with the price of shipping going up shipping cost more than our profit

-Discussed that we discontinue the "Raise the Roof" signs

-The newsletter brings in an income of \$3,000 per year

Peter Lehning moved to discontinue the "Raise the Roof Signs". Barb Benjamin 2nd. All in favor.

-Expense for "Raise the Roof" signs was \$1,300 in 2022 with an income of \$1,800

-Expense for Mileage/Tolls was raised to \$3,000

-Expense for Hotel/Lodging raised to \$3,500

-Budgeted \$1,000 for a new computer for the new treasurer

-A motion was passed to accept the budget by Tim Pallokat. 2nd by Donna Stone. All in favor.

6. Reports

a. Advisor's Report – Ashley McFarland

-The livestock educators are working on remote projects and having a series of events in 2022 -There has been no discussion about replacing Mike Baker

-Ted added on about the "Steak Holder Round Table" which is something that is starting up with Penn State University.

b. President's Report – Ted Card

-The board motioned to select Brandi Buzzard as our keynote speaker for Friday night.

-Due to a price increase in our spot at Empire Farm Days & lack of profitability it was suggested we work with the breed booths to split costs with each association responsible for their own table.

-Twin Clover also offered to let us set up a booth with them at Empire Farm Days.

-Tim Pallokat motioned to not pay \$750 for a table at Empire Farm Days and to explore further options. Peter Lehning 2nd. All in favor.

c. Herd Builder Sale

-The sale will be held May 7th, 2022 in conjunction with the Trowbridge Bull Sale -Skip Lear and Phil Trowbridge offered to look for a sale chair for the Herd Builder Sale -Quality of the animals was part of the discussion- we would like to work with breed associations to get better quality animals consigned to help make the sale more successful -It was also discussed that we do not need to have the sale online- there is an online sale charge of 6% but can be furthered discussed
